I started to really pay attention to these buildings about a month into school. Specifically Hill College House – a building students often express disgust towards.




fig. 2 Hill College House exterior




fig. 3 Hill College House facade




fig. 7 Brick width: approx. 8 inches




fig. 8 Abstract bricks




fig. 11 Cutting posters at 2am




fig. 14 Poster on Charles Addams Fine Arts Hall
